
History of Serbs in the UK

Serbian City Club

- Independent and non-political organisation established to promote the interests of the Serbian professional community in the UK
- Founded in the late 1990's as an informal club for young Serbian professionals
- Currently around 1,000 members and growing, mainly London-based including scientists, doctors, bankers, lecturers, civil servants...
- Monthly networking events, speaker events and "brain drain reversal" project

Serbian Society

- Charitable organisation established to nurture Serbian cultural heritage and promote Serbian culture in the UK
- Formed in 1995 by a number of enthusiastic Serbs; has been a cultural bedrock for the Serbian community in the UK since its formation
- Runs Saturday Serbian School for children (aged 3-14) teaching Serbian language, Serbian School for foreigners and English school for Serbian senior citizens
- Opened the first Serbian library in the UK
- Organises various cultural events: exhibitions, plays, book readings and has its own stand at the Parson's Green fair



Serbian Council of Great Britain

- Independent, non-profit, non-political organisation established to promote the interests of the Serbian community in the UK
- Formed in 2002 with support from the Serbian Embassy and Ministry for Diaspora
- Works closely with and supports other Diaspora organisations, foremost the Serbian Society and the Serbian Orthodox Church
- Represents the views of the Serbian Diaspora in the UK and Serbia through round table discussion and the Diaspora Assembly



Integration and key issues

• UK media coverage – working towards objective reporting

- Majority of British Serbs perceive the UK media coverage of Serbia as one sided and biased. Positive example: coverage of our February 2008 protests in front of the Downing Street; First Serbian week in the UK

- Cambridge University 7 students from a top Belgrade school admitted to Trinity College in the same year
- British Embassy in Serbia Chevening scholarships

Integration and key issues

- Visa restrictions hamper cultural, educational and other links with Serbia:
 - Serbs coming to the UK are still paying very high fees and occasionally enduring lengthy application and entry process
 - The visa regime is costly for both sides
 - Visa regime review in 2011
- Re-establishment of the APPG for Serbia/ Western Balkans
- Re-introducing the Serbian language in the British educational curriculum
